PROCLAMATION

- WHEREAS, Usher Syndrome is a rare genetic disorder caused by a genetic mutation resulting in hearing loss and visual impairment, and is a leading cause of combined deafness and blindness; and
- WHEREAS, more than 400,000 people are affected by this genetic disorder worldwide, with as many as 25,000 of those in the United States; and
- WHEREAS, Usher syndrome, an incurable disorder, causes suffering from severe balance issues due to vestibular dysfunction, vision loss due to pigmentosa (RP), and hearing loss.
- WHEREAS, there are three clinical types: Type 1, Type 2 and Type 3, which are distinguished by the severity and age when the signs and symptoms appear; and
- WHEREAS, because of limited public awareness, those affected with Usher syndrome may suffer from depression, anxiety, isolation, loss of independence; and
- WHEREAS, the Usher syndrome community is uniting around the world to spread public awareness but especially to be recognized annually the 3rd Saturday of September.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Kim Reynolds, Governor of the State of Iowa, do hereby proclaim September 16th, 2023, as:

Usher Syndrome Awareness Day
